The course will provide trainees (operatives, managers and supervisors involved with the use of safety harnesses/working at height) with a good theoretical and hands on understanding of the principles for using PPE (Personal Protective Equipment) and FPE (Fall Protection Equipment).

- Accident statistics
- Hazard analysis and risk assessment
- Fall prevention, fall restraint, fall protection and fall arrest
- Harness types and design standards
- Component parts of a fall arrest system (A, B, C, D, E)
- Identifying correct tie-off and anchor points
- Pre-use inspection of harness and lanyard with a practical exercise
- Rescue provision requirements
- Correct wearing and fitting of harness (practical exercise)
- Harness/lanyard storage, care and cleaning
- Selecting the correct type of harness for use
- Selecting a suitable lanyard
- Record keeping
